

Consultation process

- A draft version of the Standards was presented for structured consultation to the ICBN national conference at the end of 2016
- Draft circulated to a wide-ranging consultation in 2017. Over 60 written feedback forms from organisations and individuals, all welcoming the work and providing vital insights and comments
- By October 2017 the final edits incorporated the views and comments into this publication
- Launched by the Ombudsman for Children, Dr Niall Muldoon in November
