I am very pleased to share the news that St Francis Hospice Dublin has now received full planning permission for our new 24 single-bed in-patient unit in Raheny. Construction will begin in early 2025, and we plan to open the facility to patients before the end of 2026.

The new in-patient unit is essential to enable St Francis

Hospice to continue to meet the needs of our growing community in North Dublin and surrounding counties. Over a 25-year period, the increase in patient beds from 19 to 24 will allow us to provide in-patient care for an additional 3,000 people and their families. The single rooms will provide the privacy that families need during a vulnerable and emotional time in their lives.

All of us in St Francis Hospice appreciate how our community has embraced and supported the hospice over the past 35 years.

As we begin this new phase of building, we are confident that individuals, families, community groups, and corporate supporters will together enable us to meet the financial challenge that lies ahead. About a third of the estimated €29.8m cost will be funded by the Health Service Executive. We are so grateful to those who have already supported and committed to the build, and we are looking forward to meeting others who are keen to help.

As I reflect on the growth and development of St Francis Hospice over this time, I very much keep in mind that our staff, volunteers, and management are custodians of the hospice, which truly belongs to the community.

In its first year, St Francis Hospice looked after several dozen patients, all being cared for at home, from a base of a Portacabin on the grounds of the Capuchin Friary in Raheny. Now in its 35th year, St Francis Hospice looks after more than 2,000 patients and their families each year from two dedicated hospice facilities in Raheny and Blanchardstown. These beautiful and welcoming hospice buildings exist thanks to

our wonderful community in North Dublin and the surrounding counties. It is one neighbour reaching out a helping hand to another.

Our vision is to keep expanding our services until every person in our community who may benefit from specialist palliative care has an opportunity to receive it, and this is what fundraised income allows us to do. Thank you for joining us in striving toward this goal.

Garden Upgrade for Patients and Visitors

This summer, with support from the Cadbury Foundation and a generous gift from a member of the community, our Raheny in-patient unit gardens were improved to enable easier access for patients who wish to enjoy the outside space.

Kennedy Fitzpatrick Landscape Architecture (KFLA) generously provided their design expertise without charge in memory of a loved one who was cared for by St Francis Hospice. Their creative and functional design allows patients in wheelchairs to access raised flower beds to ensure they can partake in gardening. It also provides better accessibility for patients who are bedbound to have access to the gardens.

A second phase will begin shortly to add a children's play area for our younger visitors to enjoy. It will be situated close to the children's play room for the convenience of visiting families.

When the new in-patient unit is completed in 2026, patients and their visitors will still be able to enjoy this refurbished garden, just a short walk away. The current in-patient unit will be converted and used for people attending as outpatients. The improved gardens will be important in their care, with the raised flower beds allowing access to gardening activities for patients attending occupational therapy sessions, for example.

Living Today, Building for Tomorrow

The hospice philosophy is centred on helping people with life-limiting illnesses to live as fully as possible through pain and symptom management as well as psychological, social and spiritual support from the hospice. With this in mind, we have named our fundraising campaign for the new Raheny in-patient unit Living Today, Building for Tomorrow.

Living Today, Building for Tomorrow is a philanthropic campaign that aims to secure long-term, strategic support from both individuals and companies. Planned and strategic giving in this way can be transformative.

"Shenda's Journey" Memorial Walk

Shenda's journey began on 6th March 1993, the day she was born. Shenda sadly passed away on 6th March 2024, her 31st birthday, in the loving care of her family and the loving care of the staff of St Francis Hospice in Blanchardstown.

Shenda was a beloved wife, daughter, sister, granddaughter, niece, cousin and friend to all. Shenda was fun-loving, caring, strong willed and had a zest for life. She was kind-hearted, warm and friendly and that is the way her family will always remember her. She always had a smile on her face, an infectious laugh, and looked for the positives in any situation.

Shenda was diagnosed with brain cancer in September 2020 at the age of 27. Upon receiving this devastating news, Shenda courageously took on board the battle she would have ahead of her in relation to her treatment, challenges and uncertainties that lay ahead. Shenda fought her battle with dignity, courage, grace and a style of compassion that only Shenda could achieve. She was an inspiration to us all.

Shenda arrived in St Francis Hospice at the start of January 2024 and was cared for there until her passing on the 6th March. Whenever Shenda visited hotels or any destination, she would always send us a video of the hotel room she was staying in, and her room in St Francis Hospice was no exception! It was videoed at all angles and sent to us all to let us know she was happy with where she would be staying. She liked the feeling that she was at home and St Francis Hospice was exactly like that home.

While Shenda was a patient of the hospice, she married her fiancé Marty on 20th February 2024. When Shenda and Marty decided to get married, not only did family get involved to make their day special for them, so did the staff of St Francis Hospice! They went above and beyond the call of duty to make her and Marty's day wonderful and

special to them both. As a family, we are so eternally grateful for the memories we have of that day.

Our family took part in a memorial walk called "Shenda's Journey" on 20th



April 2024 in the Phoenix Park alongside friends and colleagues of the HSE Addiction Services in CHO9. This was to fulfil a promise that we made to Shenda before her passing. We were delighted to raise more than €9,000 for St Francis Hospice.

We know Shenda would have tried to support St Francis Hospice for all the care, love and support the entire staff had shown her and our family while she was a patient there.

Previously, while battling cancer and in between treatments, Shenda completed a sponsored walk and donated €1,750 for the neurology department in Beaumont Hospital where she first started her treatment. Shenda knew that she would not be able to complete a walk for the hospice and raise money like she had previously, but we all know she was there in spirit and knew we would do her proud.
